


5-YEAR IMPACT REPORT 2017-2021

Prepared in 2022 by Health Improvement Partnership of Santa Cruz County

Founded in 2002, SNCC is a group of dedicated operational and medical clinic leaders committed to collaboration over competition. Members come together to improve health outcomes and access for Santa Cruz County residents who receive care through publicly-funded programs, such as Medi-Cal, and the uninsured. At SNCC, members work together to develop solutions to address common challenges, share expertise and best practices, and improve quality of care.

SNCC member organizations are thriving and expanding, despite the unprecedented challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. This report presents clinic utilization data from calendar years 2017 - 2021. Data was collected from the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD) or was self-reported by clinics. Clinics include County Health Services Agency, County Mental Health Services, the Diabetes Health Center, Dientes Community Dental, Dominican Mobile Wellness Clinic, Planned Parenthood Mar Monte, Salud Para La Gente, and Santa Cruz Community Health.

19% From 2017 to 2021 patient visits in the safety net increased by over 19% (35,704 additional visits)

Medical visits increased by nearly 23% over the same five year period (45,537 additional visits)






